Gospel Side ~ Third Window from the Altar

“And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave it unto them saying, ‘This is my body which is given for you; this do in remembrance of me.’ Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you.’” Luke 22:19, 20

Symbols:

The hand of God, the creator with the triangle and halo suggests the eternity of the Trinity, without beginning and without end. Below the hand of God is Christ rising from His tomb holding the banner of triumph.

Two Tau crosses of the two thieves and the Latin cross with the wreath depict Calvary and represent triumph over death.

Crossed cat-o-nine-tail whips and flagellation post portray our Lord’s passion. The spear depicts the one used by the Roman soldier to pierce Christ’s side at His crucifixion.

Christ is shown at the Last Supper holding the chalice in which is a host. The jug of wine and loaves represent the Holy Eucharist.

The cross and orb above the water illustrate the idea of Christian Mission, for Christ told his disciples to “go...and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. The cross and orb are also called The Cross of Triumph.
