*Dear Brothers and Sisters,*

This Lent I feel myself being drawn to the Cross. Do you? Different people resonate with the varied strands of our faith in different ways, and I've always been focused more on the Incarnation and all of Jesus' life and work, of which Good Friday is just a part.

However, this Lent, due to the many losses and struggles in our society and in our community, and in our world, and the very dark parts of human nature being exposed on the national political stage, I've felt myself being led back to the foot of the Cross. I've wanted to stand with Jesus there in sadness and confusion and wrestle in prayer with how his death speaks to us now, in 2018. How does what happened then save us today? How does it unite us more deeply to God?

The series of worship services of Holy Week (really one service in several installments) are the Church's invitation to each and every one of us to ask these same questions as we walk again the path of Jesus' suffering and death.

Every time I enter into Holy Week with my heart and soul open, I find God touches me in a different way. I invite you to join with the rest of the Body of Christ for all of this Holy Week — Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil or Easter morning — as we contemplate the journey Christ's human body took — and journey together as his risen Body into Resurrection life.

## From the Senior Warden...

We are now into the third week of lent, which brings to mind a very significant event that occurred towards the end of our Lord's ministry. That event is the washing of his disciples' feet. As Jesus told his disciples, He came to serve, not to be served; and in doing so, He taught them the importance of ministering to others.

In last month's issue of *The Wayfarer*, Father J.J. shared Father Scott's article on Influential Leadership. Father Scott was the presenter for the Vestry and Leadership retreat held on January 20. Father Scott brought with him, a very treasured piece of scriptural sculpture; that of Jesus washing one of the apostles' feet. He set it on a table during his presentation. The purpose of this was to remind us that serving is about who we serve, not about us.

What *is* very important about us as a congregation and as individuals, is to ask ourselves: why are we here? When organizations have a project or a mission to accomplish, most start with brainstorming to develop a vision statement and eventually a mission statement. These are usually reached by asking what, how, and why questions. As a congregation, the first question asked should be: why? Why are we here? The answer should be: to serve our Lord by serving others in the propagation of His Word, and by ministering to the sick and those in need.

Then, come the next questions, which are how and what? How do we accomplish this? What must we do to accomplish this? Every Sunday, after the Service, we are dismissed with the admonition to "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord" or, "The Worship is over, the Service begins". These words should not ring empty, they are not just words in the BCP. These should be words that each individual should live by because Jesus calls us *all* to be his witnesses. We can do this in our individual lives and as a congregation.

We should recall that Stewardship has three components which are time, talents, and treasure. All of these components are very important for the Church to accomplish its mission. These three components are like the legs of a three-legged stool, the stool cannot stand with two or one legs; it needs all three for strength and stability.

St. Christopher has about 29 ministries that almost every member of our congregation can be involved in. Two of these, The Healing Service and the Bible Study are beneficial to congregation members who need physical as well as spiritual healing, and for those that want to learn more about the scriptures and how they apply to our everyday lives. We should know more about our faith so "...that we will not be deceived by those who try to lead us astray...".

Our faith is not a spectator event, it is a hands-on, everyday, life-long activity. With all due respect, I acknowledge those who cannot serve because of health reasons, or work and school activities. I also want to acknowledge and thank all who do serve in one or more of our ministries, and to all for continuing to be faithful to their pledges.

In January of 2017, when I was appointed by Father J.J. as Senior Warden; I told the congregation that I was honored to serve, and that I would need their patience and assistance as I undertook this important ministry. I also asked the outgoing Sr. Warden, Bruce, to guide me as I learned and grew into the role. I am into my second year as Sr. Warden, and I am still learning. Most ministries are OJT (on the job training).

To those that may not want to serve because they are intimidated or may be apprehensive of whether they can do the job, I leave you with this thought: "The expert in anything, was once a beginner".

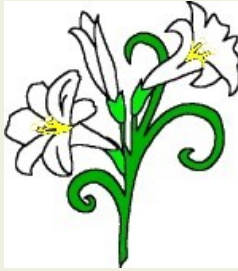

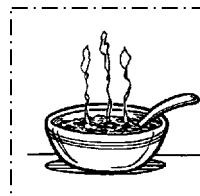
